

Luke 21:21

***“those who are in Judea must run away to the hills;
those who are in the city must leave, and
those who are out in the country must not go into the city.”***

We are given these three instructions by Jesus for the time of the end. This document relates the meaning of those instructions.

Revelation chapter 18 discusses the fall of Babylon. In Genesis 11:4, Babylon built a tower to try to reach heaven:

[4] And they said, Go to, let us build us a city and a tower, whose top may reach unto heaven; and let us make us a name, lest we be scattered abroad upon the face of the whole earth.

[5] And the Lord came down to see the city and the tower, which the children of men builded.

[6] And the Lord said, Behold, the people is one, and they have all one language; and this they begin to do: and now nothing will be restrained from them, which they have imagined to do.

[7] Go to, let us go down, and there confound their language, that they may not understand one another's speech.

[8] So the Lord scattered them abroad from thence upon the face of all the earth: and they left off to build the city.

[9] Therefore is the name of it called Babel; because the Lord did there confound the language of all the earth: and from thence did the Lord scatter them abroad upon the face of all the earth.”



North America specialises in high towers. It also has a picture of the whore of Babylon drawn into it (this is discussed in the letter about [the time of the end](#)).



The punishment of Babylon is prophesied throughout the Bible. For example, Jeremiah 24:12-14: "After that I will punish Babylonia and its king for their sin. I will destroy that country and leave it in ruins for ever. I will punish Babylonia with all the disasters that I threatened to bring on the nations when I spoke through Jeremiah — all the disasters recorded in this book. I will pay the Babylonians back for what they have done, and many nations and great kings will make slaves of them.' " So all the punishments in Jeremiah are directed towards North America. Isaiah also describes what happens to Babylon throughout his book. Here are two quotes:

Isaiah 13:19 "Babylonia is the most beautiful kingdom of all; it is the pride of its people. But I, the Lord, will overthrow Babylon as I did Sodom and Gomorrah!"

Isaiah 46:1 "This is the end for Babylon's gods! Bel and Nebo once were worshipped, but now they are loaded on donkeys, a burden for the backs of tired animals."

Revelation chapter 18 discusses how the merchants will weep because of the sudden loss of all the wealth of Babylon (*Baby London* – the East Coast cities) in just 1 hour. In 18:21 "And a mighty angel took up a *stone like a great millstone, and cast it into the sea*, saying, Thus with violence shall that great city Babylon be thrown down, and shall be found no more at all."

There is also mention of something like a huge mountain on fire being thrown into the sea (Revelation 8:8), which refers to a volcano. The island of La Palma is volcanic, and it is said that in the event of an eruption, part of the island could fall into the sea causing a huge tsunami which would affect the East Coast of America (the richest area in the world). Remember that the end is predicted to "come like a flood" by Jesus.




The word "Palm" has Biblical significance – Palm Sunday and the return of Jesus to Jerusalem. In 2007, Palm Sunday falls on April 1st (all fools day). Note also that Florida looks like a snake's head (with lake Okeechobee as the eye and Florida Keys – a series of islands – as the tongue). The State also looks like a gun. If the volcano on La Palma erupted, the resulting dust cloud would mean the moon may shine through the cloud red (like blood) thus fulfilling that sign. **God has indicated to me that this will happen.**



There is a recent precedent for Biblical tsunamis. The Indonesian tsunami had an epicentre around the island of **Sinabang** (indicating the reason for the earthquake; if you **sin** you get a **bang**).

There is a scriptural parable in Genesis chapter 19, where Sodom and Gomorrah are destroyed (representing the time of the end). Lot was staying in Sodom and served two angels by allowing them into his home. But the men of Sodom wanted to have sex with them, so these men were struck with blindness (represents the immorality of modern times). The angels had come to warn Lot and his family that the city was about to be destroyed, and encouraged them to rush to the hills. 19:17 "Run for your lives! Don't look back and don't stop in the valley. Run to the hills so that you won't be killed." 19:20 "Do you see that little town? It is near enough." The little town (Zoar) is the city of New Jerusalem described on this website, pictured here.



Jesus also tells us to run to the hills at the end. Luke 21:21 “Then those who are in Judea must run away to the hills; those who are in the city must leave, and those who are out in the country must not go into the city.” The city refers to Babylon, or rather the East Coast of America.

Either of these tsunamis would leave Africa unharmed, where God's people are. This is why we should rush to the hills to help build New Jerusalem (in fact those in the city should evacuate immediately, not necessarily to Africa). You can observe that God's people are in Africa because there is a fish drawn onto it. In fact it is a mountain range – these are the hills that we should run to at the time of the end (they are represented in the Bible as “Mount Zion,” God's sacred hill where the temple is built, eg. Joel 3:17). These are the hills to which Jesus refers.
